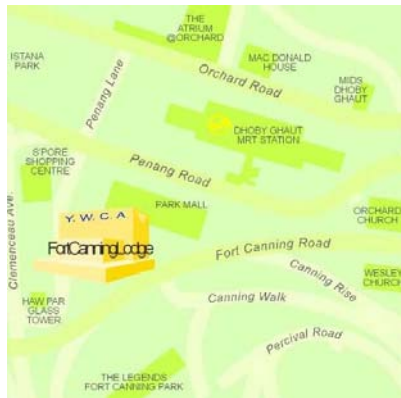

About the Workshop Facilitator



Dr. Janine M. Bernard is professor and coordinator of the doctoral program in counselor education and supervision at Syracuse University. Dr. Bernard's Discrimination Model of supervision, which was developed in the 1970's, is still a leading model for the training of clinical supervisors. She has published extensively in the area of supervision, most notably her text, Fundamentals of Clinical Supervision, with co-author Dr. Rodney Goodyear, now in its 4th edition. Dr. Bernard has delivered plenary addresses and conducted workshops on a variety of topics in supervision throughout

the U.S. and Canada, and in Europe, Asia, and Australia. In addition to her expertise in supervision, Dr. Bernard has received the highest service award from the American Counseling Association and was named a Fellow of that organization. She also served as the Chair of the Board of Directors for the U. S. National Board for Certified Counselors. Dr. Bernard is a member of Division 17 of the American Psychological Association as well as its section in Clinical Training and Supervision.
